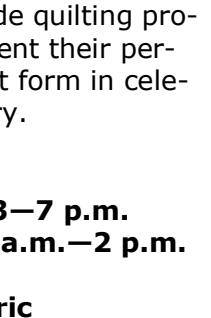
Is your house a home?

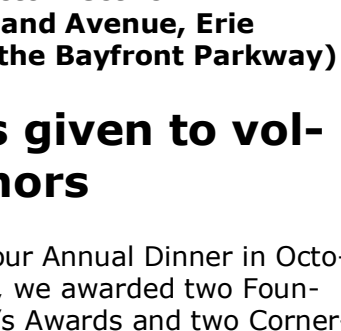

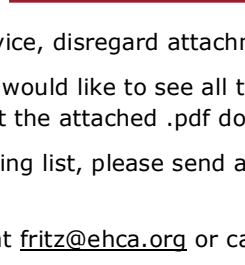
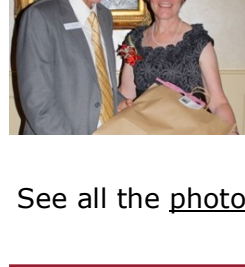
